## Clinics Column

At our October 2nd Meet, our first clinic will be:

### **“An Introduction to English Garden Railways”**

England has been the “home base” of Garden Railways for the past century. Styles and construction techniques had been well developed and long-term experiences with successful designs have been proven in this time. SCWD member Pete Olson has been involved with Garden Railways for over 30 years. In the early- to mid-1980's, when Garden Railways were still relatively scarce in North America, it was difficult to obtain a variety of first-hand experiences and information about roadbed and track construction methods and techniques applicable to the United States.

During a visit to England in 1986, Pete Olson filmed a variety of English Garden Railways and produced a video highlighting these characteristics and how the layouts were integrated into the gardens of modeler's homes while giving the audience a view of steam-powered trains running in an outdoor railway setting. Pete will provide a background to this 30-minute video and offer a few additional comments.

The second clinic will be a **report on the Garden Railroad Convention** this summer by SCWD member Paul Mangan who attended, as well as a short clinic entitled **“Taking Your Railroad off the Grid”**.

The season of 2011 – 2012 has now begun. Nikki and I are enjoying chairing the contest but we could enjoy it more if more entries were to show up for judging. I know it takes a while to get things going so here comes October.

October's theme is "Structures". Included are Stations, coaling towers, water towers, service facilities and any on line building or structure (such as bridges). See below for the four model sub-categories.

The theme is the same for the Photo Contest, and the categories are the same with Prototype and Model. In the Photo Contest you will now be allowed unlimited

entries in each category per modeler. We are hoping this will get some people to bring in photos for the monthly contests. If however this becomes a problem as it had been in the distant past we'll go back to the 10 photo limit.

One other change starting this season is the points awarded for First, Second, and Third. First will earn 10 points, Second will get 7, and Third gets 5. Also, each entry will earn 1 point.

## Oregon Museum Project:

### The SCWD in the community



It was in the latter part of spring in 2010 When Past Superintendent of the South Central Wisconsin Division, Bob Boomsma, called me on the phone and told me that he had been talking with Melanie

Woodworth at the Oregon (WI) Historical Society Museum. They had discussed placing a diorama in the museum with a scene that would resemble the area surrounding the museum about the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The Oregon C&NW Depot was located one block from the museum. Bob asked if I would be able to find some SCWD members willing to volunteer for this project. He then asked if I could follow through with the project because of his failing health. I told Bob that I would give it my best shot. I talked with both Tom Eckstein who both a Master Model Railroader and a past employee of the C&NW and Don Swinton, who's modeling ability is outstanding and both accepted the challenge. They returned the favor and recruited me. Another Division member, Larry Enlow heard of the project and he asked if he could join the crew. We all went to the museum to get some ideas on the best way how to proceed.

Researching and gathering as much information as possible was the first step. The museum had some old photos of the area and an artist's conception print with most of building locations and street names. We took this information and then set out to acquire as much of the material that we could. None of the buildings were commercially available so Don began fabricating his own buildings using solid blocks of wood. Tom was busy studying details in the photos to make sure that the little things were not over looked. Barb Rothwell joined in and hand painted the back drop using photos of buildings in the area that were probably built in this time frame and are still standing today.

The construction began in the fall of 2010. The crew met in Don's basement about twice a month over the following winter until all was completed in August 2011. On a typical hot Wisconsin August morning we moved the display into the museum and finished up the detail work. It was then encased in Plexiglas to keep any foreign objects out and preserve it for the future. The diorama has been dedicated to the memory of Bob Boomsma who never got to see the completed project.

On behalf of the construction team I want to say thanks to all of the SCWD members who donated materials and time for this project. I also want to thank Melanie and the Museum Staff as well for this opportunity to serve the community and promote model railroading and the NMRA.

There will be only one model contest during the month of April, the culmination of our Special Modeling Project. Participants in the contest judging should have adequate time for properly judging the entries and not have to try to judge two contests and keep them straight. The regular monthly contest took time and concentration away from the people judging these fine pieces of work to really make good choices.

Hopefully these changes will result in an even better Special Modeling Project for this year and a more meaningful and satisfying modeling experience for all participants.

## “The Tunnel - The Light at the End may be a Train”

Is the theme for the Special Modeling Project for this model railroading season.

We will be modeling a diorama containing a tunnel either in HO or N Scales. The Adult Category entry fee will be \$10 and the Youth Category entry fee will be \$5. These fees will be refunded upon successful completion of your diorama and entry into final judging contest in April 2012. You may sign up and pay your entry fee at the September and October SCWD meetings. The Tunnel Portals will be available for pickup at the October and November meetings. Awards will be given for best entries by popular vote at the end of the '11-'12 model railroading season.

**Project:** Build a diorama containing a tunnel in either HO or N Scales utilizing the Tunnel Portal components produced by either Woodland Scenics or Chooch Enterprises Inc. in Cut Stone, Random Stone, Concrete or Timber formats.

### Project Guidelines:

1. Must sign up at September or October meetings.
2. Pay \$5 or \$10 entry fee at sign up or when Tunnel Portal is picked up.
3. Must complete diorama and bring to April 2012 meeting.
4. Entry fee will be returned only if project is entered for judging.
5. Projects will be judged by popular vote at April 2012 meeting.
6. Awards will be presented at the end of April 2012 meeting.

### Project Rules:

1. Tunnel Portal must be added to the diorama.
2. Diorama must be mounted on a base and structure(s) and/or scenery details must be added.
3. Overall diorama base dimensions cannot exceed 288 square inches for N Scale and 576 square inches for HO Scale.

### Project Awards:

1. Awards are \$300 total in Gift Certificates to the Madison Hobby Stop as well as Award Certificates.

2. Awards in six categories:

#### Adult:

1st Place - \$75 - 2nd Place - \$50 - 3rd Place - \$25

#### Youth:

1st Place - \$75 - 2nd Place - \$50 - 3rd Place - \$25

3. In case of ties in a category, the award will be divided equally.
4. All remaining entrants will receive a Certificate of Recognition for their efforts.

To sign up for the Project:

1. Prior to the start of the meet or at break see John Fisher to sign up.
2. Print name on entry sign up roster and if possible, pay \$5 or \$10 entry fee at this time.
3. Tunnel Portals of entrant's choosing will be delivered at October meeting for those signing up in September.
4. Those signing up in October will get their Tunnel Portals at the November meeting.
5. **NO SIGN UP** after the October meeting.

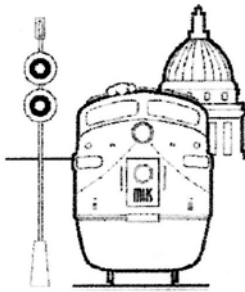

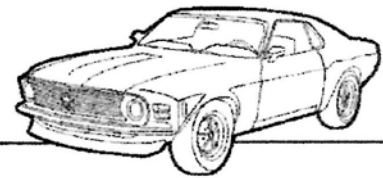

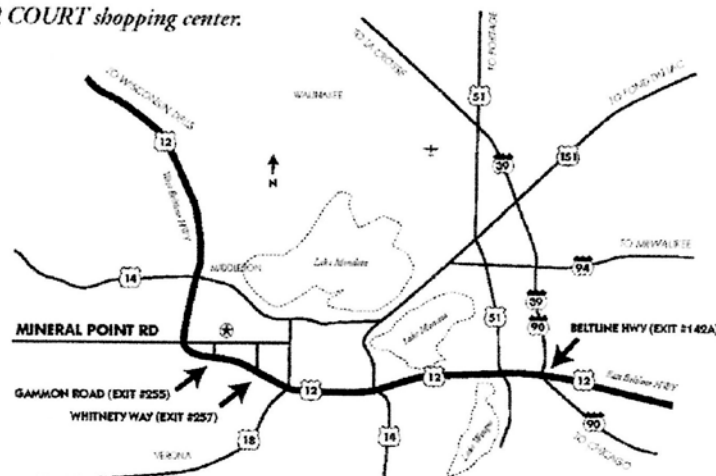
