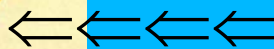
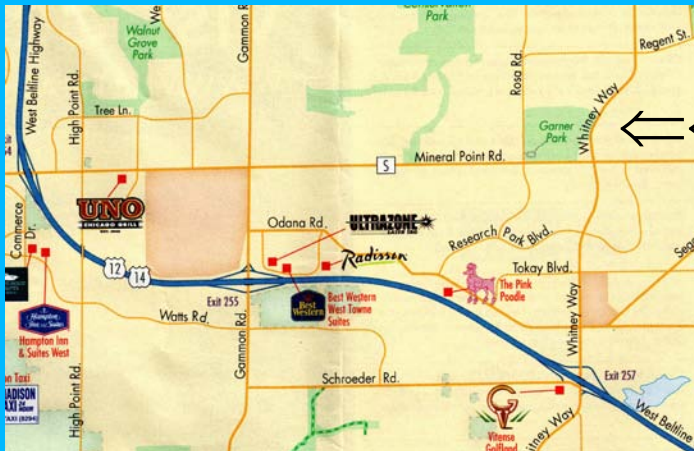

I remember one meeting where I had the gavel and needed attention from the group and banged on a beer bottle and of course, the gavel broke. Most of the many meetings were calmer than that.

There were about 30 NMRA members in our area at the time. Over the years much has changed in every aspect in the SCWD. Growth has been great and there are many more members and events.

Bob Dunham was in the Air Corp during WW2 as a Sergeant Major assigned to Japan. Over the years he and his son Jim ran a Stamp and Coin shop in Middleton. Bob also made architectural Models as a business and then sold N gauge models over the internet. When he quit HO he sold many of his items to me, also giving me many old paper items including old catalogs and other various items. I visited with Bob several days before he died and it was wonderful talking about old times and what has gone on over the years.

His friendship, kindness and helpfulness to me and the SCWD members will be long remembered.
