Trainfest was enjoyable, I saw several SCWD members there, including some volunteers.


I'll be working the next few weeks on the Red Book updates, and you should see an email with a link to a secure site where you can download it by mid-December.

Clinic Column

Bob Wundrock

For December we have two clinicians from different parts of the USA.

Our first clinician is Joel Morse from Southern California. His clinic is Overview of Modeling the New York, Ontario and Western Railway in N Scale.

His presentation provides a brief history of the NYO&W and explains why he chose to model the NYO&W, along with the basis for modeling this segment of the railroad in the summer of 1954. The next portion of the presentation provides an overview of the components of this 125-square foot E-shaped N Scale NYO&W. This section will describe the physical plant, and explain the operational concept, including the rationale behind the selection of Car Cards and Waybills for car forwarding and the hybrid method of train management, as well as crew positions and train types.

Joel is a member of the Cajon Division of the Pacific Southwest Region/NMRA with which he's held several offices. He's given clinics at Division, Region and National conventions as well as authored several articles that appeared in various publications.

Our second clinician is Bob Frankrone. He will present Creating Operations on the Louisville Southern Lines.

In his clinic Bob discusses how he transformed his Louisville Southern Lines (LSL) layout into an operating layout long after it was designed and built. He presents a short history of the layout; describes the cities, towns and industries and diagrams the LSL route map. Bob explains his requirements for model railroad operation, the constraints his layout poses, and the mechanics of an operating session on the LSL.

Bob has been a model railroader and a member of the NMRA for over 35 years. His model railroad, The Louisville Southern Line, has been featured in a couple of model railroad publications and continues to be a work in progress. Bob is the author of the series "Love Those Loads" appearing bi-monthly in the *NMRA Magazine*. He has presented countless clinics over the years at both regional and national NMRA conventions. Bob lives in Louisville, Kentucky and is a member of Division Eight of the Mid-Central Region, NMRA.

A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's



layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with 3 introductory puzzles to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.


The listserv is a one-way email broadcast to you, not a social media type service. The emails are sent in bulk, but as a BCC: type email.


OPS Puzzles




