Clinic Column

For our February clinics we'll have two experienced model railroaders.

Our first will be Bernie Kempinski presenting "Manifest Destiny - The USMRR Aquia Line."

It is a well-known axiom that model railroads expand to fill all available space. Bernie will describe how he used system analysis tools to help design the optimal plan for his expanding O Scale USMRR Aquia Line railroad. He'll also discuss what's new on the railroad including an automated telegraph, random events, time table and train order operations in the 19th century, AI enhancements and 3D printing. If you're not interested in the techy stuff, there will be plenty of pretty pictures, bad jokes, and dancing girls. There will even be a movie. Just kidding about the dancing girls, but come anyway.

Bernard Kempinski is a freelance writer and award-winning modeler and photographer who has written dozens of magazine articles and several books on model railroading. He is an active modeler and has built models on commission for museums and individuals. He is a certified Master Model Railroader by the National Model Railroad Association. A former U.S. Army captain, Bernard is retired defense analyst. See his blog for more info on his layouts and projects.

Our second clinic will be "Railroading Along the Waterfront with Walthers: Some Modeling and Prototype Ideas," with John Teichmoeller.

His clinic covers close prototypes for the models produced in Walthers' Waterfront series, discusses some improvements, illustrates some suggestions for modifying and kitbashing them, shows examples of modeling work already done using them and gives references. He will take some quick looks at the numerous additional rail-marine products introduced after the Walthers project. Some ideas will even be offered for those of you who like this stuff but who have absolutely no use for carfloats and floatbridges in your operational scheme. Along the way, he will share some stories about the research that went into the subjects and the development of the products.

John Teichmoeller has been an NMRA member continuously since 1978 and lives in Ellicott City, Maryland. He models an HO scale fictionally industrialized seven-mile stretch of the Old Main Line of the B&O in the Patapsco River Valley west of Baltimore, Maryland. The time period is late 1967. The layout occupies a 20 x 20 foot basement space, with the core of the layout built by Lance Mindheim. He is interested in freight cars in general with an emphasis on eastern railroads, the B&O, PRR and WM in particular. He served as coordinator of the Rail-Marine Information Group from 1993 to 2007.

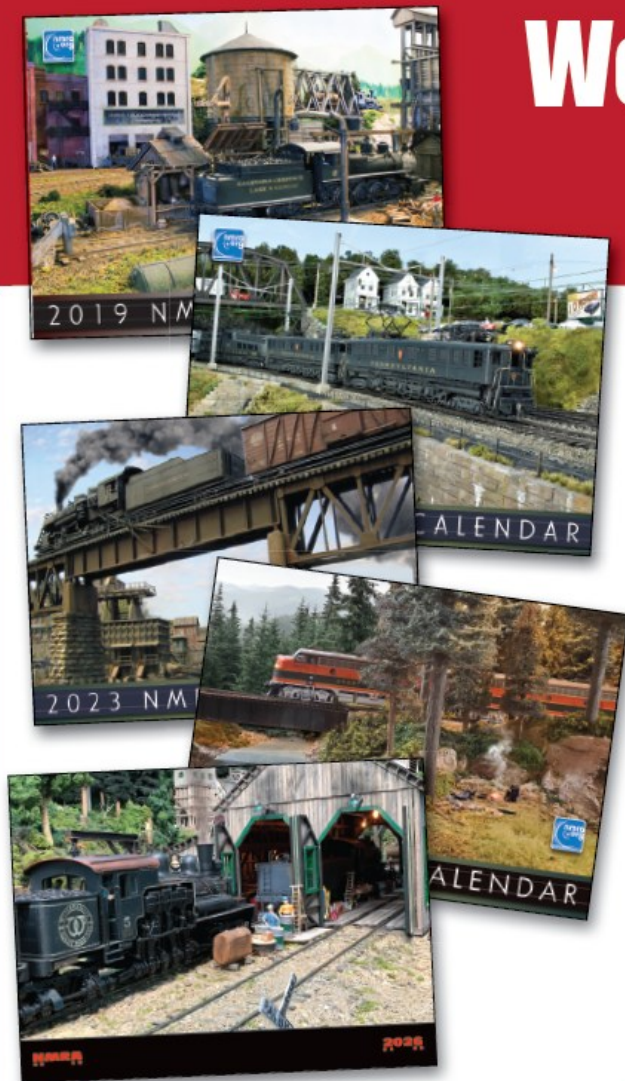

A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with **3 introductory puzzles** to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.

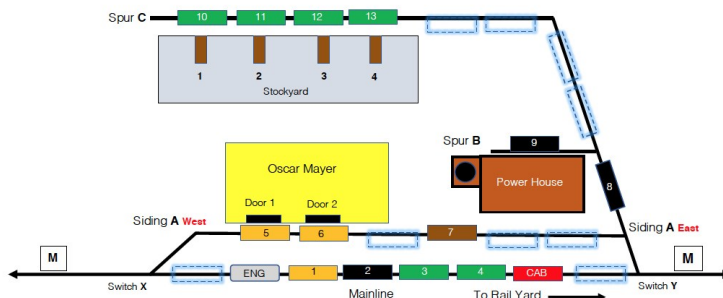
The listserv is a one-way email broadcast to you, not a social media type service. The emails are sent in bulk, but as a BCC: type email.

OPS Puzzles

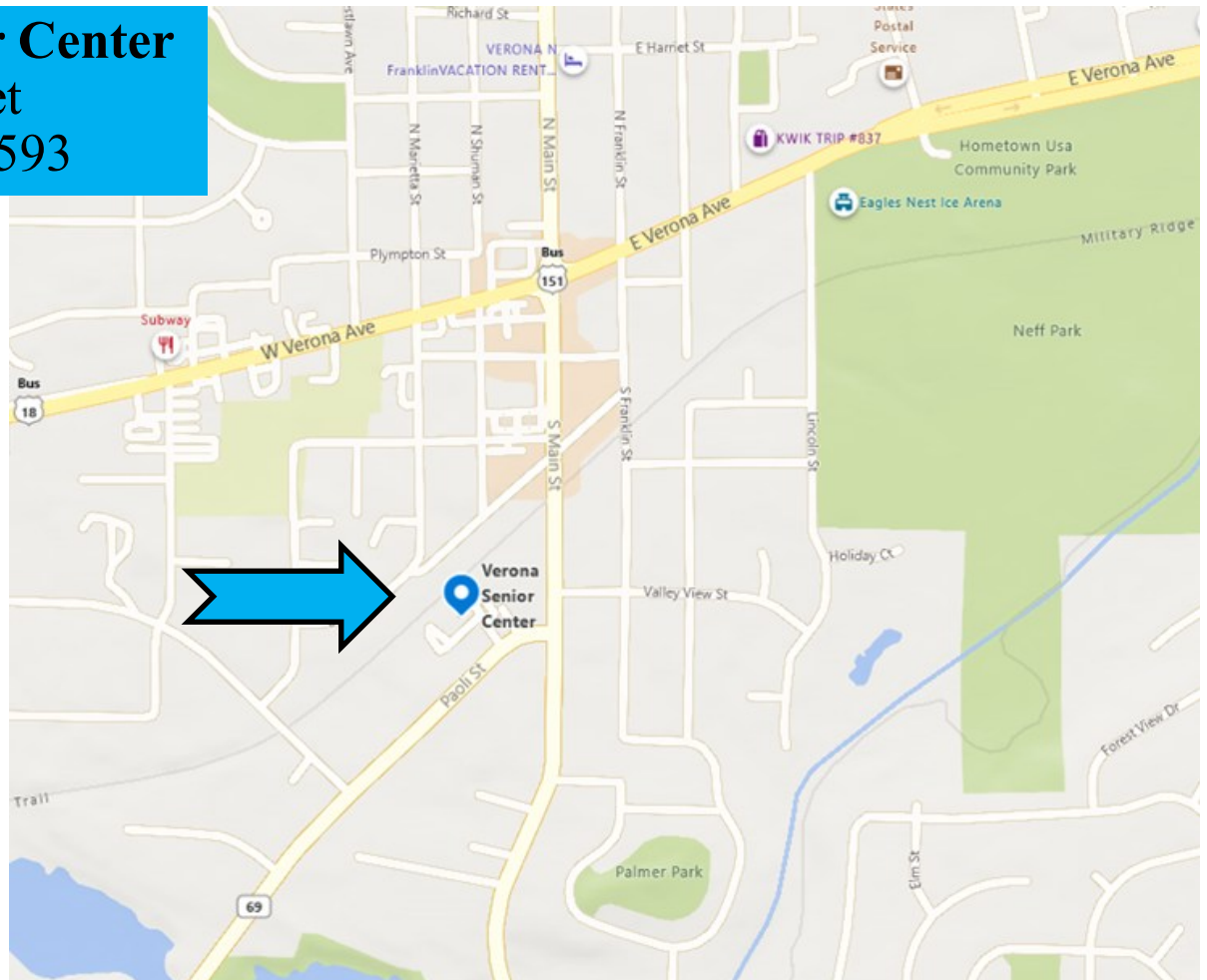

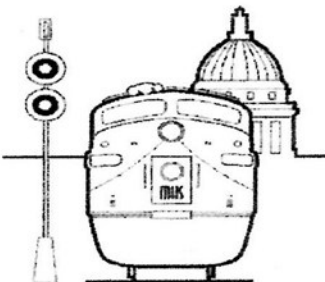
