## Clinic Column

Bob Wundrock

Our first clinician for the March meet will be Dave Ackmann from the St. Louis area Gateway Division. He'll present his clinic on Amazing Arduino Animations.

The clinic takes you from the basic concepts to procuring components and simple programming of Arduino microprocessors. It then expands on different components that can be added to Arduinos to provide sound, lighting and motion effects, creating vignettes of action to bring life to your model railroad.

His website ([daackm.github.io/Handout.pdf at master · daackm/daackm.github.io · GitHub](https://daackm.github.io/Handout.pdf)) provides a handout for this clinic.

Our second clinic will be John Sethian talking about Modeling 2 Rail O (1/48) Scale.

His clinic presents the basics in modeling 2 rail O Scale (1/4" = 1 ft). It covers the advantages of 2 rail O scale (its large size conveys the feel of massive moving machinery), debunks a few myths (such as a relative unavailability of locos and cars, the need for a lot of space, and the lack of 2 rail layouts), and talks about sources and manufacturers of locomotives and cars. It gives techniques for converting 3 rail equipment to 2 rail operation. Track, control systems and scenery are discussed. The clinic finishes with further sources of information such as O Scale Central, O Scale Resource Magazine, and O scale 2-rail shows.

John lives in Northern Virginia. He has modeled in virtually every scale except Z and S. His current layout models the PRR in O Scale under wire (i.e. catenary) through New Jersey in 1956. The layout has been featured in O Scale Trains, Model Railroader, Railroad Model Craftsman, and was in the 2022 and 2026 NMRA calendars.





## A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?



Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

**Beginners** can start with **3 introductory puzzles** to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.


The listserv is a one-way email broadcast to you, not a social media type service. The emails are sent in bulk, but as a BCC: type email.

## OPS Puzzles




